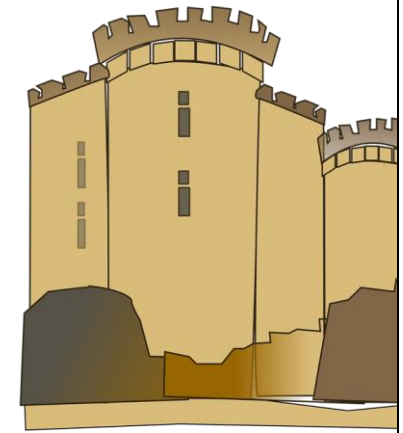

Spellings

- provide 3 possible spellings for the correct one to be selected
- check the children can say/write the spellings without support
