



Year Three Spring Term Curriculum Letter

We hope you all had a lovely Christmas and may we wish you a very happy and prosperous New Year.

As we have now started the Spring term, we would like to inform you of the topics that we will be covering until Easter.

Curriculum coverage:

In English, we will be following the National Curriculum's objectives, exploring a range of genres through our topic based learning. In the first half term, our topic will be **Zero Waste** and in the second half term, our topic will be **Ancient Egypt**. In the first half term, writing will focused around the book 'One Plastic Bag'.

In the second half of the term, writing will take a variety of forms, from instructions on making Egyptian masks to explanations of the mummification process. Children will continue to benefit from daily guided reading sessions as well as our 'Drop Everything and read' scheme.

In Maths the children will work on objectives from the new national curriculum. The emphasis is on using a variety of approaches to solve problems and to increase accuracy and efficiency as well as explain their thinking and processes. Children will find that having a secure knowledge of multiplication facts (times tables) will be very useful, which may be something we would like you to continue to support them with at home. Please note - time is a difficult concept for some children to grasp so any support at home would be appreciated e.g. asking your child questions about the time, reading timetables/T.V. schedules. Money can also be tricky, so experimenting with how many ways your child could make a pound for instance would be beneficial. Children will be developing the use of more formal written methods in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. In the later part of the term, they will be focusing on measure, money and statistics.

In Science we will use a wide range of approaches to develop scientific skills in general and will look specifically at applying these through studying and investigating, Nutrition and Habitat and in the second half of the term, Magnets.

Computing is used to support the wider curriculum and through developing skills following the Trust's scheme of learning. Between now and Easter, our topic is E Safety. During these sessions children learn how to keep themselves safe online and we strongly encourage parents to be extra vigilant when children are researching and using the internet. In addition to the set scheme, we will be teaching skills associated with PowerPoint, in order for the children to effectively create an electronic book, linked with our English work.

Through our RE topic, we will be investigating Hinduism and also, how Easter is celebrated in the Christian church.

P.E. lessons will take place on a Monday morning from DF coaching and will be outdoors (weather permitting). Children are encouraged to continue to wear comfortable clothing as we will be taking every opportunity to work outdoors as the weather begins to improve again.

Our DT and art work are based around our South Africa and Zero waste topics. In the first half of term, we will make sculptures based on the art of the African Gakonga. We will then work on making Egyptian masks in the second half of the term.

Our work to promote Social and Emotional aspects of learning will focus on 'Going for Goals', 'Good to be Me!' and the Anti-bullying agenda. Circle Time and thinking skills sessions also provide opportunities to develop understanding of a wide range of issues.

For music, the children will be taught by Mr Newton, a specialist teacher. Their work will cover musical terminology, notation and then applying this through learning a musical instrument.

Homework

Homework will continue to be sent via Parentmail and submitted via Class Dojo. Can you also please ensure homework is completed as this teaches children to work independently and take some responsibility for their own learning? This is an important life skill, which will help them in future years.

Reading - We ask that pupils read regularly at home. Your child should still be bringing home their reading record and each time your child reads to an adult or family member, please continue to sign their book as evidence of this.

Other information.

Could you please make sure the children have a healthy snack and water for Prime Time? The water bottle should have a sport style lid to minimise spillage if it should accidentally be knocked over.

We look forward to a very productive term. If you need to contact us for whatever reason, please do not hesitate to get in touch. Remember, we are eager to start your child's learning each morning, so after school or via the school office, would be preferable.
