Friday	<p>Mental Maths – complete the Flashback 4 questions on the flipchart Pdf.</p> <p>Today you have a Maths Challenge to have a go at. Work through the flipchart PDF (Maths Challenge 15.1.21) This will outline the activity for you to investigate.</p> <p>This is a Maths Investigation. Remember what we discuss in school about investigations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Let us see your working out. Even if you don't find a solution, it helps us to see your thinking process!	<p>Read the non-fiction text "Roald Dahl."</p> <p>Once you have read and understood it, answer the questions based on what you have read. Think really carefully about the questions and remember our work in Guided Reading in school:</p> <p>~Look for any key words in the questions ~Read the text again and underline the key words from the questions.</p> <p>This should help you find the answers.</p> <p>Remember to write in full sentences.</p> <p>Daily Reading (15 minutes)</p>	<p>Today we are going to be writing a 100WC. This is your chance to show off!</p> <p>Work through the PowerPoint PDF (English 15.1.21) which will show you the picture that you will be basing your writing on.</p> <p>Look carefully at the picture and decide what the story could be. Then write a short story (please don't worry about counting words!) showing off all of the things you have learned in Year 3 so far. Remember your sentence types and of</p>	<p>Work through the PowerPoint (Gakonga – African Art). This will show introduce you to the artist Gakonga and show you some of their work.</p> <p>Once you have looked at their work, your task is to recreate one of their pieces called 3 African Men.</p> <p>Try and recreate the bright colours that are used in the original, however if you do not have access to colour, don't worry! You can focus carefully on recreating the shapes by drawing the outlines and perhaps experiment with shading using your pencil.</p>
