Thursday	<p>Work through the power point 'Give Change'. There is also a video of the power point that you can follow at https://vimeo.com/499227948</p> <p>If you have any issues accessing this video, please get in touch via Class Dojo.</p> <p>The PowerPoint begins by demonstrating two different methods you could use to work out the calculations. It then explains how to use the number line to work out how much change would be given.</p>	<p>Read the text "Tour de France." (Reading Activity 4.2.21)</p> <p>Once you have read and understood it, answer the questions based on what you have read. Think really carefully about the questions and remember our work in Guided Reading in school:</p> <p>~Look for any key words in the questions</p> <p>~Read the text again and underline the key words from the questions.</p> <p>This should help you find the answers.</p> <p>Remember to write in full sentences.</p> <p>Daily Reading (15 minutes)</p>	<p><u>This PowerPoint comes with additional Coaching Commentary.</u></p> <p>Today we will introduce the Problem to our readers.</p> <p>The Problem is something that is causing trouble for one or more of the characters.</p> <p>In our story this could be that fish have died, turtles died and Dugongs have died, all because of plastic being thrown into the river and being swept out to sea. Another issue is that when the plastic is being burned it creates a lot of pollution both in the air and in the water.</p> <p>We need to continue to make our paragraph interesting for the reader, so today I would like you to include a Double 'ly' Sentence in your writing.</p> <p>What is a Double 'ly' Sentence?</p>	<p>Work through the following PowerPoint</p> <p>KS2 Single Use Plastics : Renewable Alternatives</p> <p>This will summarise the learning from last week by explaining what single-use plastics are and show ideas for re-using single-use plastics.</p> <p>We know that all these innovative ideas, just like Isdatou's idea of recycling plastic into purses in our story 'One Plastic Bag', are a result of people working together with a common purpose of wanting to improve their environment.</p> <p>The aim of today's lesson is to understand how these ideas start from identifying a</p>

	<p>The PowerPoint then goes on to explain how you can use the bar model alongside the number line to work out how much an item costs using the change given and the total amount you started with.</p> <p>Once you have worked through the PowerPoint, complete the worksheet provided.</p>		<p>That's correct, a Double 'ly' Sentence is another form of descriptive sentence. It has two 'ly' adverbs after the verb. The 'ly' words can be at the beginning or the end of the sentence.</p> <p>As a starter, rewrite the two sentences as Double 'ly' Sentences.</p> <p>Task Today your task is to write the next section of our story – the Problem. Use your planning on your story mountain to help you. You must include a Double 'ly' Sentence at least once in your Problem.
