

Battle of Bosworth	Fought in 1485, it was one of the last battles of the Wars of the Roses. It marked the beginning of the Tudor dynasty.	<p>After half term, we will be learning about The Tudors. On the reverse, you will find some suggestions that you could carry out to enhance learning around this theme should you wish. These are just suggestions and you are more than welcome to add your own.</p> 	<p>1485: Henry Tudor ends the Wars of the Roses and becomes the first Tudor king – Henry VII by defeating Richard III at the Battle of Bosworth.</p>
Catholic	A Christian who follows the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church (led by the Pope in Rome.)		<p>1509: Henry VIII becomes king on his father's death.</p>
Globe Theatre	An open-air theatre built in 1599. It was where many of William Shakespeare's plays were first performed.		<p>1534: Henry VIII becomes Head of the Church of England after a quarrel with the Pope about his divorce from Catherine of Aragon.</p>
heir	A person who inherits the crown after the current king or queen dies.		<p>1547: Edward VI becomes king at the age of 9. He is a Protestant.</p>
monarch	The head of state, usually the king or queen.		<p>1553: The Catholic Mary I becomes queen. Nicknamed 'Bloody Mary'.</p>
Protestant	A Christian who is a follower of any church that is not Roman Catholic.		<p>1558: Elizabeth I becomes the last of the Tudor monarchs. She is a Protestant.</p>
ruff	A frill worn around the neck. Popular for both men and women.		<p>1587: Catholic Mary, 'Mary Queen of Scots' is beheaded for plotting against Elizabeth.</p>
The Mary Rose	King Henry VIII's favourite warship, built in 1509. It was named after his sister.		<p>1588: English victory over the Armada sent by Phillip II of Spain.</p>
Treason	The crime of betraying your country.		<p>1603: Elizabeth dies. James VI of Scotland becomes James I of England uniting both kingdoms. The Tudor dynasty ends.</p>
Wars of the Roses	A series of battles that took place in England from 1455 to 1485. The fighting was between two houses who claimed the right to the throne – the House of York (white rose) and the House of Lancaster (red rose.)		<p>Significant Individuals</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around;"> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Henry VIII Henry VIII was king of England from 1509 to his death in 1547.
