Reminder about the **school Book Fair** – week beginning 7th November – Mr Jefferies will send out a schedule if you wish for your child to bring money in to buy a book (The incidentals which are sometimes part of this event – erasers, slap bands etc. are not being provided this time). Parents are invited if they wish to attend without their children on Wednesday 9th November 3.00 – 4.00pm entry via the small hall door.

Following on from the message sent just before the break – please support us in **keeping our site safe** and keep the pedestrian gates shut. As many of you will be aware, the automatic gates are temperamental (despite our efforts to ensure they are serviced and in good working order); so your support in shutting the gates is crucial – thank you.

Christmas in school – we have reflected on the lessons we have learned over the last couple of years, when we had change enforced on us – and being able to focus on the planned curriculum during the half term up to Christmas has been a real gain. So, this year instead of multiple performances in a jam packed school hall, we have negotiated the use of Yarm Auditorium where children from Y1 – Y6 will present their Christmas performance – Winter Song – on Wednesday 14th December at 1.30pm. Admittance will be by ticket only and these will go on sale (£1 per ticket to cover costs) shortly, with 2 tickets per family being available. Our Early Years families will be invited into school to share some Christmas treats with the children – look out for the flyer with details this week. We hope this will be a great experience for the children and of course for our audience and will allow us to continue delivering the planned curriculum right up until the end of term. Ho Ho Ho!

As you may know and as Early Years parents have already been informed, **Miss Puttick** starts her adoption leave soon – we wish her well and look forward to welcoming her and her son into school before the end of term.

Their first scheme is the main school library, which since the pandemic is looking very unloved. A BIG THANK YOU to the group who have made a great start in updating and relaunching this important learning space – we are looking forward to opening the library over lunchtimes and to inviting you in to see our work once it is complete. Look out for the story sessions our staff will be offering to your families.

Thank you so much to parents who contact us offering a wide range of **support and resources** for us in school – the books you contribute, games, computers etc. allow us to make the limited resources in our school budget go a little bit further. Also, thinking of us and how your work roles can contribute to the development of our curriculum offer through your skills is another way some people are contributing – thank you so much.
