

Yorkmead J&I School - Pupil Premium Strategy Statement 2020-21

At Yorkmead, we believe that every child is an important member of our community and should be encouraged and challenged to achieve their full potential. The school budget is set by governors entirely on this basis - the key investment priority is always on initiatives that support all of our children to progress as governors, staff and parents would wish. The Pupil Premium Grant is just one part of the overall funding we invest to achieve this.

In the 2020 to 2021 financial year, all schools receive £1345 for each child registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years. For children who are a LAC or were previously LAC all schools receive £2345. Our total number of PP children was 126, making our total PP budget: £ 169,470

Barriers to learning

The barriers we recognise as impacting on our disadvantaged pupils' learning are:

- Poor language and communication skills,
- Lack of confidence,
- Social and emotional difficulties
- Poor attendance and punctuality issues
- Complex family situations that prevent children from flourishing and parents from sometimes giving support with learning.
- Lack of cultural experiences

The challenges are varied and therefore we respond to the individual needs of our children.
