## Year 2 SATs

Well done to all of our Year 2 children for completing their SATs this week. The children have worked incredibly hard and have taken each paper in their stride to show what true champions they are. We are all very proud of their efforts.

## Values - Thoughtfulness

Every term one of our Monday assemblies will link our termly value to a religious story. Christianity was the focus this term and 'The Good Samaritan' was the story I chose to read to the children. Here is what the children said they had learnt from the story:
'We should be kind and help people even if they believe in different things.'
'We can be thoughtful to people that we don't know' 'Being thoughtful costs nothing but we should be open to giving to others.'


## Sun Cream and Sun Hats

On hot, sunny days please provide children with sun hats and/or sun cream. Children may bring a small named bottle of sun cream into school to keep in their tray but this cannot be applied by an adult in school. Children will also need a water bottle in school so that they can drink plenty and stay hydrated.

## Attendance

Maintaining good attendance in school is vital for academic achievement. Regular attendance ensures students do not miss lessons, discussions, and activities. It cultivates responsibility, discipline, and punctuality. If a child's attendance drops below $95 \%$ it will be monitored and our policy will be followed to ensure attendance

## Safeguarding Update - Trusted adults

In school, we teach the children that all members of staff can be viewed as 'trusted adults'. This means that children know they can talk to adults about a worry. Children have a 'safeguarding hand' where they write down the names of adults and children who they most trust to share a worry with. In addition, our children have been taught and understand our safeguarding lanyard colours too-
Green = a member of staff who the children can be alone with.
Yellow = an person who they can be left alone with who isn't staff.
Red = a person who they can't be left alone with as we do not have any DBS information on that person.

All children have small worries from time to time, and usually we can help with these by talking to the child. If an adult thinks a worry is more significant, staff are trained in how to record this and pass it on to a member of the school Safeguarding Team - Mrs Johnson, Mrs Udale and Mr Morris. We then work together to help the child, speaking to parents when required and at times external agencies.
Our brilliant pastoral team also help with the children's worries - Mrs Pelling (Family Support) and Mrs Clark (ELSA).

Evidence has shown that the parents who support their children to prepare and read regularly with/to their child, make significant more progress, although we also understand some of the pressures at home, especially through parental deployment.
