

English: Our text for the term will be 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers

- Daily phonics sessions
- Role play and active learning
- Grammar rules taught explicitly
- Writing descriptions

DT: (Textiles: Puppets)

- Join fabrics together using pins, staples or glue.
- Design a puppet and use a template.
- Join their two puppets' faces together as one.
- Decorate a puppet to match their design.

Maths:

- Addition and Subtraction
 - Number facts of numbers 17 - 20
 - Partition numbers to 20
 - Represent addition and subtraction facts
 - Understand and use the symbols + - and =
- Fractions
 - Recognise half as one of two equal parts.
 - Find half of objects and amounts.
 - Find one quarter of objects and amounts.
- Geometry (Position and Direction)
 - Use mathematical language to describe position, movement and turns, including one quarter turns, half turns and three-quarter turns.

Science: Seasons and Weather

- Observe changes across the four seasons observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.
- Understand the differences between the four seasons and when they occur in the calendar year.
- Understand a range of weather types and how they link with the weather.
- Gather and record data to help in answering questions.
