#### Values-Friendship

Each term, the children engage in lessons that explicitly teaches the value of friendship. We talk about what it looks like, how to show the value and the positive consequences that happen when a community uses their values. Below is a selection of work produced in these lessons.

#### Safeguarding

Roblox is popular online gaming platform, that offers a creative and entertaining space for children to explore virtual worlds, connect with friends, and unleash their imagination through game creation. While Roblox provides a positive gaming experience, it's crucial for parents to be aware of potential risks. The main concerns include exposure to inappropriate content, online interactions with strangers, and the possibility of encountering cyberbullying. To ensure your child's safety on Roblox, consider these three essential tips:

- 1. **Enable Parental Controls**: Utilize the platform's builtin parental controls to manage your child's account settings, restrict certain features, and monitor their interactions.
- 2. **Establish Open Communication**: Foster a dialogue with your child about their online experiences. Encourage them to share any concerns or uncomfortable situations, and provide guidance on appropriate behaviour and the importance of respectful online interactions.
- 3. Regularly Review Friends List and Privacy Settings: Periodically check your child's friends list and privacy settings to ensure they are only interacting with people they know. Educate them on the importance of not sharing personal information online and being cautious about accepting friend requests from strangers.

By staying informed and actively engaging with your child about their online activities, you can create a safe and enjoyable gaming environment on Roblox. I have also added a helpful guide to this newsletter. If you have any concerns regarding this, please get in touch.

#### **Kind Minds Curriculum**

This week, the children have been using the 'The Butterfly Hug'. Cross both hands over your chest and place each hand on your chest or shoulders. Gently begin tapping each hand one at a time on your chest. Tap for 10 counts. Pause and take a deep breath. Continue tapping until you feel calm and relaxed. You might want to say some kind words to yourself e.g. "I am calm" or "My body is a safe place to be."

Please feel free to try this mindfulness at home too to establish calmness when needed.



#### Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check

The multiplication tables check (MTC) is statutory for all year 4 pupils registered at state-funded maintained schools, special schools or academies, including free schools, in England. The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for current and future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided. In 2024, schools must administer the MTC to all eligible year 4 pupils between Monday 3 June and Friday 14 June.
