Kind Minds Curriculum

This week, the children have been using the 'Thank you body'. Stand or sit in a comfortable position. Stretch your arms up as high as you can and say, "Thank you, hands, for reaching way up high." Wrap your arms around your body giving yourself a big hug. Say, "Thank you, arms, for giving me hugs." Place your hands on your heart. Take a deep breath in and out. Say, "Thank you, breath, for calming me." Please feel free to try this mindfulness at home too to establish calmness when needed.



Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check

The multiplication tables check (MTC) is statutory for all year 4 pupils registered at state-funded maintained schools, special schools or academies, including free schools, in England. The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for current and future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided. In 2024, schools must administer the MTC to all eligible year 4 pupils between Monday 3 June and Friday 14 June.
