All children learn at different levels but the government sets expectations for children in each year group. By this stage of Nursery, we want children to be able to do the things listed below. We have also said how you can help your children do them:

Communication and Language	How you can help:

	and use language to differentiate length.

To sing to match the pitch and tone sung by another person.	Sing nursey rhymes/simple songs to
